- In 2018, Rock River Free Clinic celebrated **15 years of serving our community!**
- We participated in **5 parades and over 25 events** this past year to help “spread the word” about our clinic.
- We have had over **30,000** medical office visits since we opened in 2003.
- There are still approximately 5,000 in Jefferson County without health insurance!
- Our typical patient in 2018 was a working female between the ages of 45-64.
- We help reduce use of the local Emergency Room – **saving our community money!**
- We can now connect our patients to resources for non-medical needs.
- In 2017 RRFC was awarded the WAFCC (WI Association of Free and Charitable Clinics) **Bronze Provisional Seal of Excellence.**

A Message from the Executive Director

This past year has been a year of new beginnings and planning for the Rock River Free Clinic (RRFC). We began what we hope is a long term partnership with the University Wisconsin-Whitewater Master of Social Work (MSW) program. We are hosting a student intern for the school year. Each new RRFC patient completes a questionnaire that asks about what non-medical needs they may have (including: transportation, housing, family care, safety, food, etc.). Positive responses are referred by Dr. Rutledge to the MSW intern who provides necessary resources to the patient in need. The MSW intern stays in touch with the patient to help resolve the issue/s at hand. Through this process, we hope to improve the overall health and well-being of our patients because we realize non-medical issues are many times linked to health status.

In addition, Dr. Rutledge has announced his retirement effective September 2019. This has led the RRFC Board of Directors to think more strategically about both our short and long term future. Regardless of the final solution, we realize how very fortunate we are to have such meaningful partnerships with Jefferson County and Fort HealthCare. Rounding out that equation are Tomorrow's Hope, United Way and dedicated volunteers and donors who together have ensured the sustainability of our community free clinic. We are also so very grateful to Dr. Rutledge who has been such a guiding force for RRFC. His practice style and way of making patients at ease in a potentially awkward setting is exemplary. He has been the perfect fit for our free clinic – we would not be who we are without his leadership.

As we enter a year of change for RRFC, we enter it with pride in what we have built and how we have served the community well for 15 years!


